Puget Sound Polo is a youth water polo program designed to introduce the sport of water polo to new athletes, as well as continue the development of athletes with experience. On most occasions, athletes will be divided into two groups based on their experience, swimming ability and their desired commitment to youth water polo. Each practice will focus on the following polo skills:

- Swimming
- Treading
- Passing / Ball Handling
- Shooting
- Defensive Positioning
- Offensive/Defensive schemes

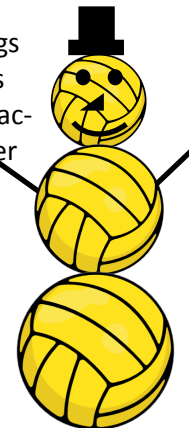
